

Calling all teachers! Earn \$1,000 when you become qualified to teach dual enrollment courses!

Dual enrollment is rapidly gaining interest among students in Arizona and across the country, yet there are a limited number of teachers qualified to teach dual enrollment courses. Research shows that students who take dual enrollment courses are twice as likely to go to college, earn higher GPAs, and complete their degrees.*

Incentive Eligibility Requirements (must meet one of the following):

- Teachers who become qualified to teach dual enrollment between April 2024 and December 2025.
 - Must be approved to teach a new dual enrollment course with an Arizona post-secondary institution between April 2024 and December 2025.
 - Current dual enrollment teachers who become qualified to teach an additional dual enrollment course also qualify.
 - (Example: a current calculus teacher now teaching dual enrollment college algebra or English teacher who taught dual enrollment creative writing now teaching English 101/102).
 - Dual enrollment courses must be on the [ElevateEdAZ list of qualified courses](#). These are courses that have high transferability and/or are part of the AGEC (Arizona General Education Curriculum).

Incentive Reporting Process:

- Teachers who would like to participate in the ElevateEdAZ Dual Enrollment Teacher Incentive must:
 - Complete the [New Dual Enrollment Teacher Form](#), including proof of newly approved dual enrollment course registration.
 - Forms will be reviewed on a weekly basis.
 - *Funding is limited and will be approved on a first-come, first-served basis (check out website for updates on funding availability).*
